

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# Vernon Township Zoning

Anyone bringing in a PARK MODEL trailer must <u>FIRST</u> get a permit approved by Tall Timbers. The office now has the permit you will need for approval. Once approved by Tall Timbers, it then needs to go to Vernon Township for approval. You will also need a permit from the building department.



All park model trailers must have tie downs!

## Guest Procedures & Parking Passes



PARKING PASSES All guests entering Memorial Day through Labor Day will need a <u>prepaid</u> parking pass. Invoicing for your guests parking pass will no longer be an option. This season, site owners *must prepay* for their guests parking pass, *OR*, your guest can pay the \$10.00 at the gate. <u>This is a CASH ONLY option.</u> Security cannot accept credit cards or checks. <u>Access will not be given</u> to any guest that does not have a prepaid parking pass or the \$10.00 CASH. No exceptions.

<u>Guest Procedures:</u> Guests <u>must</u> be registered with security (973.875-6060). No guests will be admitted until the guest can be verified with the

site owner & a paid parking pass is issued. The contact numbers you listed on the 2023 information sheet is the number security will use to contact you. Guests will not be permitted unless security speaks with you.

## Personal Site Rentals

<u>Site Rental:</u> The Administration Fee for Personal Site Rentals has increased from \$25.00 to \$50.00. An updated Rental form is available upon request from the office. <u>It is out of courtesy</u> that the office requests at least 48 hours prior to your guests arrival. *You must also notify your village board that renters will be at your site.*

# Propane Information

#### OTHER FACTORS THAT MIGHT DISQUALIFY A TANK REFILL

An expired tank isn't the only reason your tank might not be eligible to be refilled. Propane tanks need to have a device on them called an OPD, or Overfill Protection Device. When a tank is being filled with propane, these devices automatically shut off the valve when the tanks reach a certain capacity. If your tank doesn't have an OPD, we aren't able to fill that tank. Another factor which might cause a tank to be

disqualified from being refilled is its general condition. If your tank has visible rust or damage anywhere on it, it could be unsafe to fill it and therefore would be disqualified from receiving a refill.

#### RECERTIFIED TANKS

Tanks that are past their normal expiration date can be re-certified by someone who is trained to do so. If the inspector deems the tank's condition to be usable, they will put a sticker on the tank with an "E" after the manufacturing date. This "E" adds another 5 years to the life of the tank.

#### TALL TIMBERS PROPANE TANKS FOR PURCHASE

If you have a tank that has expired, for your convenience Tall Timbers sells new 100# and 20# tanks. We will remove your expired tank and make sure that it is properly disposed of!

Propane Costs for new 100# and 20# tanks, and the fill are:

100# \$210 (+ tax) Propane Fill \$110.00

20# \$70 (+ tax) Propane Fill \$22.00

PLEASE BE AWARE, IF YOU PLACE AN ORDER FOR A 100# PROPANE REFILL, AND THE TANK IS NOT EMPTY OR IF IT IS EXPIRED, THERE WILL BE A \$25.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE ASSESSED TO YOUR ACCOUNT. IF YOU PAY WITH A CREDIT CARD, THE 2% FEE CANNOT BE RETURNED

**Expired tanks CANNOT be filled!** Any tank that is older than 12 years of age (for 2022 that means tanks made before the same month of 2010) is expired and cannot be refiled.

#### **How To Check Your Tank's Expiration**

Every tank of propane has a date stamped into the collar along the top of the tank. There are some important numbers and letters here that mark:

- Serial Number
- Water Content (WC)
- Tare Weight (TW)

#### **Manufacturing Date**

The date is shown in MM-YY format, so to know if your tank is expired just subtract 12 from the second number. If your stamp is not more recent than the current month 12 years ago, your tank is **expired.** 



We do NOT have a city sewer system, we have independent septic systems.

Use water efficiently, conserve when possible.

**Do NOT** flush or pour down the sink the following items: Cooking oil, paint, dental

floss, tampons, condoms, diapers, cotton swabs, cigarette butts, coffee grounds, cat litter, paper towels or food

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

## PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE WILDLIFE

There are bears in the campgrounds all the time. This is their home. They look for food and have been spotted climbing into our dumpsters and bringing out food garbage bags. We do our best to deter them but these bears have become accustomed to humans. If you put your food garbage in the dumpster instead of the compactor, they will drag it



out and make a huge mess. Besides the aesthetics, it can become a health hazard! It also takes our Maintenance Crew away from other important jobs. <u>ANY KIND OF FOOD GARBAGE MUST GO INTO THE COMPACTOR!!</u> If the bears find food in the dumpster, they will continue to go there & make a mess of <u>your</u> campground. Please do your part and put your trash in the right place. <u>Be considerate!</u> <u>Your</u> Maintenance Department will have to pick up after the bears...and you! Help us keep your Tall Timbers clean!

#### "One Call System"

When a One Call notification goes out, please listen before calling the office. Immediately calling the office defeats the purpose of the system and inundates the office with unnecessary calls.

Remember, Tall Timbers is a 'smoke-free' campground. No smoking is permitted on common property.

# Buy a Brick Program

Tall Timbers is a special place for all of you! Many of you grew up here and are now raising your own families here. New owners are starting to create their own TT memories. What a great way to beautify your 'home away from home' while leaving a lasting legacy.

Each red brick measures 4x8. You can engrave up to 21 characters on each line. The brick will hold four lines. You are also able to use symbols, for example ♥,&, etc. The cost of each brick is \$50.00. Symbols cost an additional \$5.00 each. For example, if you order one brick and include a ♥ in your design, the cost would be \$55.00. You must also specify how you want your wording to appear, all capital letters, only first letter capitalized, etc.

If you are interested in purchasing a brick simply complete the form located in the office and return it to with your check for \$50.00 (plus the cost of symbol if chosen). Please make sure you note 'brick' on your payment. A sample of the brick can be seen at the office!



### TALL TIMBERS' RULES AND REGULATIONS

(REVISED AS OF 3/1/2015)

These rules simply compliment the Village and Association By-Laws and Master Deeds that still are in effect and must be adhered to.

#### GENERAL RULES

- The declarant, the TTPOA, the council and the administrator shall comply with all provisions of NJAC 8-22-1.1, ETSEQ relating to campgrounds. Thus, from November 1st to April 1st, the occupancy of any one (1) campsite shall be restricted to a period not to exceed ten days (10) days during any thirty-day period. Recreational vehicles when not in use may remain on the campsite. As a further means of insuring seasonal use and minimizing condominium costs, TTPOA shall discontinue all water service to the campsites in the condominiums during said period of November 1st to April 1st, inclusive of each year. Water service shall begin on April 1st, weather permitting and shall cease on November 1st, weather permitting. TTPOA shall, however, furnish water and toilet facilities at bath houses owned by TTPOA during this period. This provision is a restrictive covenant binding upon all campsite owners. Provided, however that if the laws of the State of New Jersey which are applicable to this provision shall be altered, changed, modified or amended or new laws or regulations are enacted then this provision shall be deemed to and shall be automatically amended to conform to such enactments.
- Maintenance dues are payable each year as the Village and the TTPOA Board of Directors dictate. The payments are due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of every month, payable in January, February, March, April, May, June and July. There is a 30-day grace period. An interest/late fee charge of 1.5% will be applied to any halances delinquent 30 days or more. The administration reserves the right to deny access to services and common areas of any site that remains delinquent more than 30 days. A "Service Termination Charge", monetarily determined by the TTPOA Board, will be charged when a site is deactivated for delinquency.
- No mini-bikes, trail bikes, snowmobiles, ATVs, trikes, quads or like vehicles may be operated within the community or maintained on the campsites, except for administrative purposes. Mopeds may be used as a source of transportation only. Mopeds must be registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles and proof of registration is required. All bicycles and mopeds shall be operated in a safe and courteous manner. All vehicles including bicycles operated after dark should have proper lights and reflectors. Children under 14 years of age must wear a helmet as per State law. Motorized scooters are not allowed within Tall Timbers.
- No motor vehicles shall be used for the purpose of "cruising" throughout the community. Vehicles are
  to be used solely for the purpose of moving from point A to point B.
- No hunting, trapping, shooting or discharging of firearms, arrows or other projectiles shall be permitted.
- No fireworks are permitted within Tall Timbers except where AUTHORIZED and SANCTIONED by the Tall Timbers' Board of Directors.
- No heavy objects, appliances, beds, rocks, wood, etc., are to be placed in the compactor. Leaves should be placed in <u>bio-degradable bags</u>. The Administration Office will coordinate the pick-up of the bags from the front of the site(s). Do not discard plastic bags full of leaves anywhere within the campground.

#### Water Usage Restrictions:

- Cars may only be washed at campsites from Monday through Friday.
- Decks and trailers may be washed at <u>anytime</u> from Sunday through Saturday, excluding holiday weekends.
- Holiday weekends are considered; Friday at 12:00 a.m. through Tuesday at 12:00 a.m.
- No animals or livestock of any description except the usual household pets shall be kept on any campsite. Every dog or other pet permitted in the condominium shall be maintained under control at all times and shall not be permitted to create a public health or noise nuisance. Pets shall not be left unattended at a campsite. Animal waste shall be removed immediately and disposed of in a sanitary manner.
- Quiet hours are everyday from 11:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m.
- Curfew for children under the age of 18 years is 11:00 p.m. After 11:00 p.m., anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian who is 21 years of age or older.
- Tall Timbers' common areas, including but not limited to, the beach, Bear Cave deck, volleyball courts, basketball courts, baseball fields, playgrounds and pool areas are closed at 11:00 p.m. to anyone under the age of 18 years of age. Anyone under 18 years of age in these areas will be subject to be fined for loitering. If a TTPOA function is scheduled past 11:00 p.m., these areas will close immediately after the conclusion of the function.
- Any site owner in good standing may request the use of the lounge by signing a form stating when the
  owner will be using it, that the owner assumes all liability and that the owner will clean up the area after
  use. TTPOA and the Villages have preference when its use will be granted on a first come, first serve,
  sign-up basis.
- No stripped down, partially wrecked or unregistered vehicles of any kind or sizable part and no discarded
  or abandoned material of any kind shall be permitted to be parked, stored or maintained on any campsite
  or along any driveway, road, park area or common area within the community.
- No recreational vehicle of any type may be driven or towed in a reckless manner on or along any road within the condominium or community. Further, all such vehicles must observe speed restrictions and noise limitations throughout the community as established from time to time by TTPOA.
- Alcoholic beverages are only allowed on one's site or at a TTPOA or Village sponsored or authorized function in the lounge or pavilion, meaning when TTPOA or the Village supplies the alcohol. No drinking of alcoholic beverages is allowed in or around the game room, beach, roads or common areas.
- No glass bottles are ever permitted on any common areas of TTPOA.
- No natural rock shall be painted nor shall there be introduced in the condominium such alien materials as neon signs or the like thereof.
- All sites must be identified with a number sign. The sign shall not be more than five (5) feet from the
  road, the numbers must be visible from both directions of the road and the numbers shall not be smaller
  than three (3) inches.
- No nuisances shall be allowed upon the property nor shall any use of or practice be allowed which is a source of annoyance to other people or which interferes with the peaceful possession and proper use of the property by its owners.
- All camping units must display a RVIA or RPTIA sticker to ensure that the units comply with standards implemented with the State.
- Maximum size for sheds and gazebos is 100 square feet.
  - Decks' square footage may not exceed the trailer's square footage for a maximum of 400 square feet.
  - Permits are mandatory for any placement of any structure on a site, which includes hot tubs, sheds, decks or alterations to an existing structure.

- No campsite shall be used except for camping purposes.
- No drilling for water or digging for wells shall be permitted on any campsite.
- No oil or natural gas drilling, refining, quarrying or mining operations of any kind.
- No noxious, offensive or illegal activities shall be conducted on any campsite. Nor shall any conduct or
  activity be permitted that is or becomes an unreasonable annoyance or nuisance to the condominium.
- No trash, ashes, garbage or other refuse shall be dumped or stored or accumulated on any campsite.
- No grease, cooking oils, animal fats or detergents shall be poured, spilled or otherwise disposed of on the ground within the community.
- No trees shall be removed from any campsite without the prior consent of the Village council or the administrator acting on behalf of the council.
- All campsites shall be maintained in a clean and wholesome condition. No campsite owner shall permit
  any shed, deck, trailer or any other structure from deteriorating to the degree that it is a safety hazard,
  health hazard or does not conform to the standards of the State of New Jersey or the community as a
  whole.
- No campsite shall be fenced.
- Geese, ducks or any wildlife may not be fed on common area properties.

#### SECURITY RULES

- When expecting guests, it is your responsibility to notify the gate house of their arrival.
- All visitors will be logged in with license plate numbers and the name of the owner.
- All guests are required to show their driver's license as proof of their identity.
- When registering guests, you are required to provide your pre-selected guest pin number.
- Any site owner who is delinquent on maintenance fees shall be restricted from using the amenities and will not be allowed to enter into Tall Timbers with a vehicle.
- A delinquent site owner may not be a guest of another site owner

#### CAMPFIRE RULES

- No campfires can be lit in the winter months between November 1<sup>st</sup> and April 1<sup>st</sup> when the water it turned
  off, this includes patio chimneys.
- Campfire rings shall be 36" in diameter and shall be maintained at no more than three (3) feet high.
- No open fires of any kind shall be permitted on any campsite with the exception of a campfire and such campfire must be attended at all times and thoroughly extinguished upon completion of use.
- Campfires shall be used in such a manner that they will not create a hazard to vegetation, undergrowth, trees and camping units. The burning of leaves is strictly prohibited.

### DISREGARD OF ANY RULES AND/OR REGULATIONS ARE SUBJECT TO FINES AND PROSECUTION

#### ALL AQUATIC FACILITIES

- Lifeguards are responsible for the safety and welfare of the property owners and their guest(s) when they
  are using the aquatic facilities. Accordingly, the lifeguards may suspend an owner's swimming privilege
  if the owner or their guest(s) are creating a nuisance or hazardous condition(s).
- Clothing, other than bathing suits, is not to be worn when swimming at any facility.
- No "thong" bathing suits may be worn at any facility.
- Small children, who are not potty trained, must wear diapers that are made for swimming. Children
  wearing regular diapers are not permitted in the pools and/or lake.
- No diving, flips, back dives or other stunts are permitted off the sides of the pools.
- No running, dunking, pushing in, wrestling or other horseplay is permitted.
- Use of the <u>deep water</u> area of the pools is limited to individuals who can swim the width of the pool in a satisfactory manner. Qualification is at the discretion of the pool staff and may be requested at any time.
- No glass is allowed at any facility.
- No swimming goggles are allowed with attached nose pieces.
- No eating or food of any kind is allowed in the pool area.
- Non-alcoholic beverages are permitted in plastic containers (bottles) only.
- No swimming is allowed other than in designated areas.
- No one under ten (10) years of age may use the facilities unless accompanied by a guardian who is 18
  vears or older.
- No fishing within the swimming areas.
- No swimming allowed when a lifeguard is not on duty at any facility.
- No boats of any kind are allowed within the swimming areas.
- All boats kept along the shoreline on the boat racks must be registered in the office. Upon registration, an official boat sticker will be issued and should be placed on the boat. It is the responsibility of the owner to make sure the sticker remains on the boat. A boat slip number will be assigned (when available) to your boat, you may not choose an open slot.
- No boats or rafts are to be docked on the shoreline of the lake between sunset and sunrise or at any time in the beach area. There will be a \$5.00 moving charge for those boats or rafts that have to be moved and taken away because they are found docked on the shoreline. Boats are to be stored on the assigned slip or campsite.
- All watercrafts must be equipped with US Coast Guard approved flotation devices for each occupant.
   Children 14 years of age or younger are required to wear life jackets at all times while in a hoats.
- No gas powered boats of any kind are allowed on the lake.

#### NOISE NUISANCE ORDINANCE

This policy is to incorporate Tall Timbers' regulations with the ordinances of Vernon Township and the State of New Jersey. This ordinance is not intended to end private parties on your site(s) or on the common areas of the Villages. It is however, intended to alert everyone that there is a problem and all residents should respect their neighbors during the daytime and nighttime hours.

- Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment, such
  as lawn mowers, weed trimmers, etc., shall not be operated between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.
- Construction and demolition activity shall not be operated by any property owner(s) or professional
  contractors between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. on weekdays and between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00
  a.m. on weekends.

- An exterior burglar alarm of a building or motor vehicle must be activated in such a manner that the
  alarm terminates its operation within five (5) minutes of continuous sound and 15 minutes of impulsive
  sound after activated.
- Personal or commercial vehicular music amplification shall not be operated in such a manner that it is
  plainly audible at the property line (road side) between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.
- Personal or commercial vehicular music amplification shall not be operated in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet in any direction between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.
- 6. Self-contained, portable, hand-held music shall not be operated on common area in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet in any direction between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. and shall not be heard except for the operator of the equipment between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.
- Vehicles including motorcycles, may not "rev" the engines for the purpose of sound "to show off".
   Vehicles are only to be started for the purpose of moving.

#### Definitions:

"Plainly audible" means any sound that can be detected by a person using his or her unaided hearing faculties.

As an example, if the sound source under investigation is a portable or personal vehicular sound, the detection of the rhythmic bass component of the music is sufficient to verify plainly audible sound. The investigator need not determine the title, specific words or the artist performing the song.

"Weekday" means from Monday at 8:00 a.m. until Friday at 6:00 p.m.
"Weekend" means from Friday at 6:00 p.m. until Monday at 8:00 a.m.

#### Exceptions:

TTPOA functions; Village functions; emergency repairs to common areas or individual sites.

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
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
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# 2023 - Timbers Talk Guidelines
