IMPORTANT SEPTIC INFORMATION

From the NJ Environmental Protection Agency

Toilets aren't trash cans!

Your septic system is not a trash can. An easy rule of thumb is not to flush anything besides human waste and toilet paper. Never flush:

- Cooking grease or oil
- Flushable and Non-Flushable wipes
- Feminine hygiene products
- Condoms
- Dental floss
- Diapers
- Cigarette butts
- Coffee grounds
- Cat litter
- Paper towels
- Pharmaceuticals (medicine, needles)
- Household chemicals like gasoline, oil, pesticides, antifreeze, and paint or paint thinners

Think at the sink!

Your septic system contains a collection of living organisms that digest and treat household waste. Pouring toxins down your drain can kill these organisms and harm your septic system. Whether you are at the kitchen sink, bathtub, or utility sink:

- Avoid chemical drain openers for a clogged drain. Instead, use boiling water or a drain snake.
- Never pour cooking oil or grease, in any amount, down the drain.
- Never pour paints, solvents, or large volumes of toxic cleaners down the drain. Eliminate or limit the use of a garbage disposal. This will significantly reduce the amount of fats, grease, and solids that enter your septic tank and could clog the drain field.

Maintain Your Drain Field (Disposal Field)

Your drain field—a component of your septic system that removes contaminants from the liquid that emerges from your septic tank—is an important part of your septic system. Here are a few things you should do to maintain it:

- **Parking:** Do not park or drive on your drain field or over your septic tank.
- **Planting:** Plant trees the appropriate distance (10 feet) from your drain field to keep roots from growing into your septic system.
- **Placing:** Keep roof drains, sump pumps, and other rainwater drainage systems away from your drain field area. Excess water slows down or stops the wastewater treatment process.

Su campo de drenaje, un componente de su sistema séptico que elimina los contaminantes del líquido que emerge de su tanque séptico, es una parte importante de su sistema séptico. Aquí hay algunas cosas que debe hacer para mantenerlo:

- Estacionamiento: No estacione ni maneje en su campo de drenaje o sobre su tanque séptico.
- Plantación: plante árboles a la distancia adecuada (10 pies) de su campo de drenaje para evitar que las raíces crezcan en su sistema séptico.
- Ubicación: Mantenga los desagües del techo, las bombas de sumidero y otros sistemas de drenaje de agua de lluvia alejados del área de su campo de drenaje. El exceso de agua ralentiza o detiene el proceso de tratamiento de aguas residuales.

GUEST PROCEDURES & PARKING PASSES

PARKING PASSES All guests entering Memorial Day through Labor Day will need a prepaid parking pass. Invoicing for your guests parking pass will no longer be an option. This season, site owners must prepay for their guests parking pass, OR, your guest can pay the \$10.00 at the gate. This is a CASH ONLY option. Security cannot accept credit cards or checks. Access will not be given to any guest that does not have a prepaid parking pass or the \$10.00 CASH. No exceptions.

Guest Procedures: Guests must be registered with security (973.875-6060). No guests will be admitted until the guest can be verified with the site owner & a paid parking pass is issued. The contact numbers you listed on the 2023 information sheet is the number security will use to contact you. Guests will not be permitted unless security speaks with you.



Vernon Township Zoning



Anyone bringing in a PARK MODEL trailer must FIRST get a permit approved by Tall Timbers. The office now has the permit you will need for approval. Once approved by Tall Timbers, it then needs to go to Vernon Township for approval. You will also need a permit from the building department.

All park model trailers must have tie downs!



PERSONAL SITE RENTALS

Site Rental: The Registration Fee for Personal Site Rentals has increased from \$25.00 to \$50.00. An updated Rental form is available upon request from the office. It is out of courtesy that the office requests at least 48 hours prior to your guests arrival.

You must also notify your village board that renters will be at your site. To date, Birch and Cedar have voted no to rentals are now non-rental communities!

Septic Do's & Don'ts

We do NOT have a city sewer system, we have independent septic systems. .

Use water efficiently, conserve when possible.

Do NOT flush or pour down the sink the following

items: Cooking oil, paint, dental floss, tampons, condoms, diapers, cotton swabs, cigarette butts, coffee grounds, cat litter, paper towels or food.

WiFi is now available at the Bear Cave, lower pool and beach area! The sign on information is Tall Timbers Guest and the password is Welcome1.

OTHER FACTORS THAT MIGHT DISQUALIFY A TANK REFILL

An expired tank isn't the only reason your tank might not be eligible to be refilled. Propane tanks need to have a device on them called an OPD, or Overfill Protection Device. When a tank is being filled with propane, these devices automatically shut off the valve when the tanks reach a certain capacity. If your tank doesn't have an OPD, we aren't able to fill that tank. Another factor which might cause a tank to be disqualified from being refilled is its general condition. If your tank has visible rust or damage anywhere on it, it could be unsafe to fill it and therefore would be disqualified from receiving a refill.

RECERTIFIED TANKS

Tanks that are past their normal expiration date can be re-certified by someone who is trained to do so. If the inspector deems the tank's condition to be usable, they will put a sticker on the tank with an "E" after the manufacturing date. This "E" adds another 5 years to the life of the tank.

TALL TIMBERS PROPANE TANKS FOR PURCHASE

If you have a tank that has expired, for your convenience Tall Timbers sells new 100# and 20# tanks. We will remove your expired tank and make sure that it is properly disposed of!

Propane Costs for new 100# and 20# tanks, and the fill are:

100#	\$210 (+ tax)	Propane Fill	\$110.00
20#	\$70 (+ tax)	Propane Fill	\$22.00

PLEASE BE AWARE, IF YOU PLACE AN ORDER FOR A 100# PROPANE REFILL, AND THE TANK IS NOT EMPTY OR IF IT IS EXPIRED, THERE WILL BE A \$25.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE ASSESSED TO YOUR ACCOUNT. IF YOU PAY WITH A CREDIT CARD, THE 2% FEE CANNOT BE RETURNED

Expired tanks CANNOT be filled! Any tank that is older than 12 years of age (for 2022 that means tanks made before the same month of 2010) is expired and cannot be refilled.

How To Check Your Tank's Expiration

Every tank of propane has a date stamped into the collar along the top of the tank. There are some important numbers and letters here that mark:

- • Serial Number
- • Water Content (WC)
- • Tare Weight (TW)



Manufacturing Date

The date is shown in MM-YY format, so to know if your tank is expired just subtract 12 from the second number. If your stamp is not more recent than the current month 12 years ago, your tank is **expired**.

GENERAL INFORMATION

PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE WILDLIFE

There are bears in the campgrounds all the time. This is their home. They look for food and have been spotted climbing into our dumpsters and bringing out food garbage bags. We do our best to deter them but these bears have become accustomed to humans. If you put your food garbage in the dumpster instead of the compactor, they will drag it out and make a huge mess. 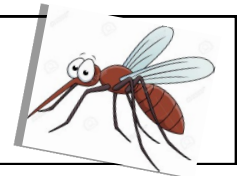


“One Call System”

Buy a Brick Program

You are also able to use symbols, for example ♥,&, etc. The cost of each brick is \$50.00. Symbols cost an additional \$5.00 each. For example, if you order one brick and include a ♥ in your design, the cost would be \$55.00. You must also specify how you want your wording to appear, all capital letters, only first letter capitalized, etc.

If you are interested in purchasing a brick simply complete the form located in the office and return it to with your check for \$50.00 (plus the cost of symbol if chosen). Please make sure you note ‘brick’ on your payment. A sample of the brick can be seen at the office!

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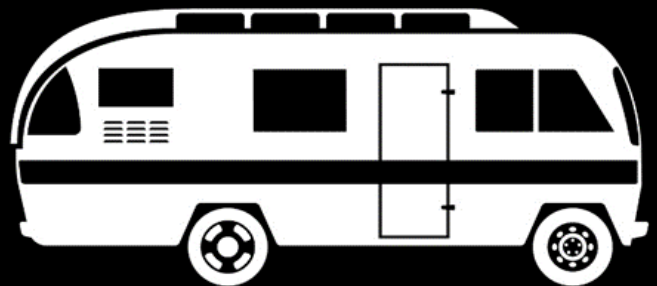
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
