FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



I can't believe summer has finally arrived and boy did this week feel like summer!!!! We were lucky that our lifeguard company was able to supply us with staff to open a whole week earlier to help you stay comfortable during this heat wave. Thank you, Adam and Staff.

Saturday June 22nd starts pools being open 7 days per week, with Friday night swims at the Lakeside pool and Saturday night swims at the mountain pool. Flea/Craft market is also on Saturday June 22nd, at the ballfield. Stop up and support our local community.

Coming up soon on July 6th is the village parade (details on Rec page) and the annual owner meeting on the Bear Cave Deck (immediately following the parade), and of course the 4th of July dance and fireworks show that evening.

Our beautiful lake glistens a shimmering blue and three beautiful fountains light up at night. Come down and look with the lights on, it's magical.

Our Rec staff are hard at work to have more activities for kids in the Bear Cave. They are always looking for ideas or volunteers. Reach out to our Rec director Meg Yar or your village representative on how.

Our garden is planted and has started growing delicious vegetables and beautiful flowers.

This is a community activity so if you want to join in, reach out to the Committee Chairpersons Tanja

Provino and Norma Griffo.

A reminder, DCA is scheduled to be on property on July 3rd for their annual inspection. Please make sure your sites are clean and numbered. Weeds must be cut, tarps removed.

With so many new residents please follow all the rules to ensure the safety of our community. SLOW DOWN. STOP AT STOP SIGNS. With many people walking to activities, we do not want to have accidents. No place you are rushing to is more important than the safety of our moms' pushing carriages, our grandparents taking a walk, or little brother riding his bike, our little sister pushing her doll stroller. We have been very lucky, let's keep it that way.

Two reminders – Water is one of our most important amenities and on holiday weekends the demand is great. Car and trailer washing is prohibited from Friday, July 5th 12 am, through Tuesday, July 9th, 12 am.

If you are having a delivery of building materials, appliances, furniture and/or gravel you must register, give the vendor your site number and meet the delivery at gate house, or it will be turned away. Repairmen also need to be registered and have site information. Large truck deliveries cannot fit on many village roads. Instruct the vendor a Moffit will be needed. Have the driver park on the main road. The office and or gate house do not accept packages, except for medication. There are local pick-up locations, if needed.

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



Reminder that the 4th of July Weekend Celebration is a Guest Vehicle Fee weekend and you must pre-register your guests as always, and you must pay the \$10 per vehicle fee by cash at the office, via credit card by going in or calling the office, or by Zelle (remember to note site number and that it is for Guest Fee). Your guests can also pay in CASH (ONLY) at the gate when they arrive but they must be pre-registered. Guests that show up at the gate and have not been registered will be asked to leave the line and contact the site owner to register them.

If everyone does their part with guest registration, the entry line on the very busy weekend will move smoothly. You can register your guests very easily by using the form on the website (talltimbers.net), or you can go to the office and register them (we now have a tablet in the office lobby where you can register your guests online). Additional amenity bracelets beyond the ones each owner has, for the use of the pool and other amenities can be purchased for \$10 each which are good for 7 days. Lifeguards will be looking for bracelets at the pool and beach so please make sure you and your guests are wearing them and show our lifeguards respect when they ask to see them.

On busy holiday weekends, trash and recycling is always an issue. You MUST dispose of your household food waste bags in the compactor and recycling in the recycling compactor. Under NO circumstances should food trash bags be put in the open top containers. It looks terrible, attracts the bears, and causes extra work for our wonderful, hardworking maintenance team. If you find that the compactor is full when you arrive to throw out your trash, ring the bell that notifies the Gatehouse Attendant or let them know that it needs to be compacted. There is no reason why this area should look like a mess.

Please stop at the office and get your gate access decals if you haven't already. The deactivation date deadline for gate cards is July 9th (information can be found on the website).

On a final note, your music and the bass, should be kept at a respectful sound level so as to not disturb your neighbors. Your neighbors should be able to hear themselves in their trailers during the daytime and nighttime hours.

2024 DCA Inspection

The main and common concerns the DAC inspectors will be looking for are, but not limited to:

- Property is numbered. Site numbers are clearly visible
- Property is clear of weeds, leaves, etc overgrowth promotes rodents
- Property free of garbage, broken glass, bottles and other litter
- Standing water to prevent mosquitos
- All buildings, structures, and decks, are in good condition, no tarps
- Flammable liquids and gases
- Fireplaces properly located
- Fire hazards
- General hazardous conditions







DCA Inspections:

Our campgrounds will be inspected by the DCA sometime around the first week of July. These inspections are sneaky and we do not want them to catch us off guard. Here are a few things that the DCA will be looking for on your site. All sites must have their site numbers clearly displayed at the front of their property; if weeds or any other object is hiding your sign, get rid of them.



Unattached tanks are also a violation. All propane tanks must be attached to something- a grill or your trailer. Tanks not attached to anything must be kept in a shed. Do not bring them into your trailers as it is against the law to keep tanks in your living space.

Make sure that your site is as clean as possible. Get rid of any trash or rubble and cut your weeds and overgrown plants.

Events at Tall Timbers:



GARBAGE & DEBRIS



The dumpster area is located at the Tall Timbers entrance at the side of the Guard House. Please place your garbage in the appropriate containers.

<u>The Compactor</u> – Household garbage <u>ON-LY</u>. Place all bags containing food into the compactor to avoid attracting animals. If the compactor is full, please notify the guard on duty.

<u>The Open Tops</u> – Bulk items only. **NO** FOOD! (This will attract the bears!)

<u>Recycle Bin</u> – Paper, plastic, glass and aluminum only. Please be sure to rinse any food out.

<u>Red Dumpster</u> – Scrap metal only. Do not throw old propane tanks in the dumpster, please contact the office for proper disposal methods.

Please dispose of your garbage properly and never feed the wild animals. Animals fed by humans tend to become nuisance animals and/or become dependent on humans for survival. This is there home as well as yours; we need to respect each other. You can do your part to help prevent most problems by just respecting the wildlife laws. By doing our part we can ensure the safety of our site owners and wildlife alike!

There are bears in the campgrounds all the time. This is their home. They look for food and have been spotted climbing into our dumpsters and bringing out food garbage bags. We do our best to deter them but these bears have become accustomed to humans. If you put your food garbage in the dumpster instead of the compactor, they will drag it out and make a huge mess. Besides the aesthetics, it can become a health hazard! It also takes our Maintenance Crew away from other important jobs. ANY KIND OF FOOD GARBAGE MUST GO INTO THE COMPACTOR!! The bears in our community are wild bears; you should never feed them! If the bears find food in the dumpster, they will continue to go there & make a mess of <u>your</u> campground. Please do your part and put your trash in the right place. Be considerate! Your Maintenance Department will have to pick up after the bears...and you! Help us keep your Tall Timbers clean!
